

Easy Recipe For Wild Fowl

When the mighty hunter returns from the forest and field, it's the little woman who usually has to cook what he brings home.

Disappointment in the feast can be avoided by following a few simple recipes suggested by Lucille Ingram of Beverly Hills, Detroit Edison Home Service advisor. The following recipe is taken from this month's "Recipes and Hints".

ROAST DUCK, WILD

Temp.: 350 degrees
Time: Rare 10 to 12 min. per pound
Well done—15 to 20 min. per pound

2 (2½ lb. each) wild ducks
4 cooking apples, chopped
6 strips of bacon
½ cup raisins

Wipe ducks with a damp cloth. Rub the insides with salt. Fill the cavities loosely with chopped apples and raisins. Place ducks in an uncovered roasting pan. Cover the breasts with slices of bacon. Remove the stuffing before serving the duck: it will have absorbed the strong flavor. Note: When preparing a stuffing that is to be served, the game flavor can be removed by soaking the cleaned bird two or three hours in strong salt water to which one tablespoonful of baking soda has been added. Rinse duck in clear water before stuffing.




