

N. Adams Fire Station Ready Soon

The new Bloomfield township fire station on Westview road just off North Adams road will be ready to begin operations about Dec. 19, Township Treasurer Homer Case said this week. The station will serve all of the township's area east of Woodward. It will be equipped with a new fire truck just delivered to the township, plus an older pumper, and an inhalator. Manning the station will be two experienced towaship fremen,

and two additional firemen will be hired and trained at the main Telegraph road station. Case said the new fire station is looking for additional volunteers. Cost of the new building and landscaping is about \$45,000. Since all calls will be dispatched from the main station, township fire calls will continue to be phoned to Midwest 4-5656 even after the
