The beautifully carved canopied bed used in "The Four Poster", the Village Players' closed show on Nov. 29, was acquired by the grandmother of Mrs. Thomas O. Watts, Jr., 3140 Middlebury lane, Birmingham, from an exhibit at the Chicago Worlds Fair in 1893 and was used during her lifetime. The wood is poplar and the entire bed weighs approximately 600 pounds. Mrs. Watts' husband (above) is playing the part of "papa". The hooded wicker bassinet is a cherished family heirloom first occupied in 1891 by the show's director, Loren T. Robinson, 3120 E. Jefferson, Detroit. Since then it has been used by six other children in Robinson's family and by five of his grandchildren, four of whom now live in the Birmingham area. With it is Mrs. Thomas Watts of Middlebury.

day.

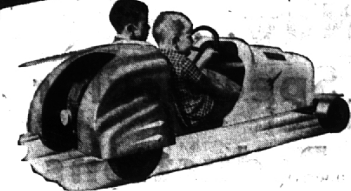
