Stamp Club Meeting

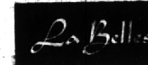
The first monthly meeting of the Birmingham Stamp Club will be held at the Birmingham Community House Monday at 8:30 p.m.

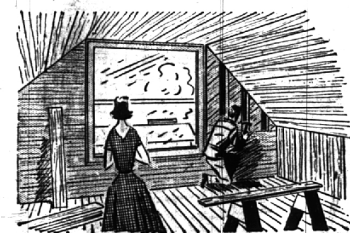
