Commercial art students under the direction of instructor Robert Naff are working on a cover design for the 1959 Blue and Gray annual.

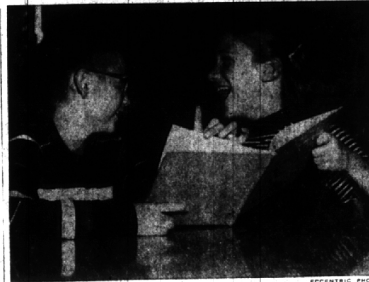

Some moms are glad to have free time when their kids are in school. But some Birmingham mothers go to school with their young scholars.

At Pierce school, 27 volunteer library workers do it. These women, who have organized and operated the elementary school's library, are celebrating Book Week Nov. 2-9.

IT is merely a climax to many years' work, under the direction of Mrs. John Strauss and Mrs. J. D. Sewell. As far as they are concerned, book week is every week. The volunteer mothers work in the library Monday through Thursday. They shelve, catalogue and order books for the youngsters and decorate the room with book displays and posters.

A CREW of five mothers works each day to help students with research, reference work and selecting books. The moms work with every grade level. Kindergartners have story hours once a month, first and second graders hear stories twice a month and third through sixth graders use the library each week.

THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS of their program are many. As a result of constant exposure to books, more Pierce students attend the Baldwin public library vacation reading club than any other students, according to Mrs. Dorothy Burns, Baldwin librarian. Pierce teachers have reported an increased interest and accomplishment in reading, due to parent-teacher program.
