CD Institute Draws Local Sci. Teachers

High school science teachers from three area high schools attended an institute on radioactivity at the University of Michigan Monday and Tuesday.

The institute was sponsored by the Michigan Office of Civil Defense and was the second of a series to be held throughout the state at colleges and universities.

Teachers from Birmingham, Berkley and W. Bloomfield high schools, who attended the conference, will be receiving radiological instrument kits to be used in a training course for the teachers.

VALUED AT \$450 each, the kits contain such devices as Geiger counters, survey meters and dosimeters and are on loan to each of the high schools for an indefinite period.

A joint announcement by state Civil Defense Director, Ralph M. Sheehan, and Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Lynn Bartlett, said, "This is just the beginning of a nationwide plan to train one million students in the use of radiological measuring instruments—an ability which could be of critical importance in this nuclear age."




