Cranbrook School Musicians Join With 12,500 Others

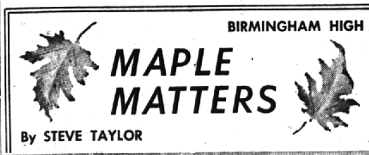
