A Madrigal group will meet and study some ancient Madrigals. Madrigals are short love poems with a musical setting.

The enthusiasm among the vocal students is great for these various groups and we feel that they will be a great success. They are sure to hold better musical minds.

Records are played in the morning as the students enter school. This is greatly enjoyed by the students. Some of the ninth grade girls are singing songs during lunch hour to entertain the students while they are waiting to return to their classes.

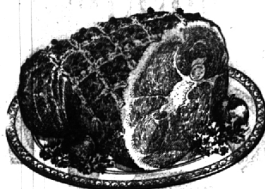
