The U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C. will accept applications for an examination for postmaster of Bloomfield Hills until Oct. 21.

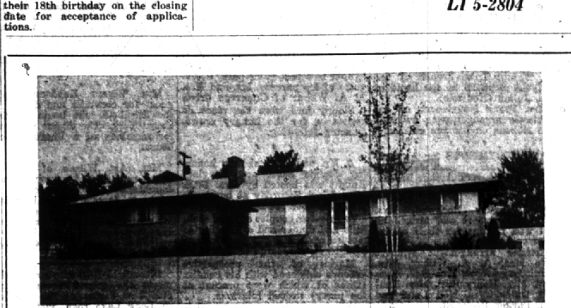
Competitors for the postmaster vacancy must have at least two years experience showing that they have the ability to conduct and manage the community's postal business.

In addition, they must have reached their 18th birthday on the closing date for acceptance of applications.
