Mayan Art On Display

CRANBROOK — "The Maya" is the title of an exhibition newly arranged at Cranbrook Institute of Science, showing the art and architecture of the Mayan in three different mediums: lithographs, paintings and photographs.

Dr. Robert T. Hart, Institute director, says the exhibition was planned by staff member Laura Lojice in great interest and background for the many people in the community who will be visiting Mexico this winter.

Colored lithographs of the great temples and tombs in Uxmal were made by Frederick Catherwood in the early 19th century when he accompanied explorer John Stephens to Yucatan in 1839 and again in 1842.

THIS TRIP resulted in pictures and writings which brought the ruins of Mayan cities to the attention of the world for the first time, showing cultural achievements of the Western Hemisphere in Guatemala, British Honduras, Honduras and Mexico in the early Christian era, 317-987 A.D.

A group of paintings by Louis Freund from the Ford Times Collection of American Art, and Laura Gilpin's photographs made between 1932 and 1946 show temples, pyramids and idols from Yucatan.
