

Holy Name Beats Guardian Angel



Student Debaters: U of M Will Help You Make a Point

When Birmingham high school students debate, the University of Michigan will back them up with the facts they need.

The library extension service, a department of the U of M library, will give practical help to any Birmingham students and instructors interested in debate and discussion programs, according to Miss Clover Planders, chief extension librarian.

To the schools enrolled in the

first semester Michigan High School Forensic Association program, the help is in the form of both a package of material on the debate topic and the debate bibliography.

For the second semester program, information is given about sources of suitable materials for speech activities.

As soon as the debate topic is selected, the library extension service will gather material until every possible source has been canvassed. The amount of material that can be supplied varies each year since it depends on the topic chosen, and the general associations and institutions interested in and willing to support one or the other side of the proposition.

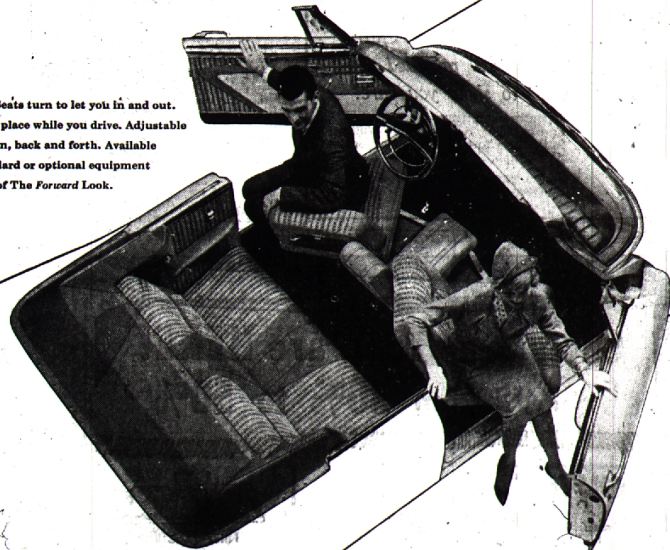
