Public Invited To Westwood Zone Talks

WESTWOOD—As the newly organized Westwood planning commission got its operation rolling last week with the services of a volunteer secretary and the appointment of two sub-committees, the commission called for its first public discussion on zone change requests.

Community spirit prompted Mrs. H. G. Noyak, 2691 Kinnross, to volunteer to be chairman of the new group. After reading in The Eclectic about the village planners' need for clerical assistance, Mrs. Kinnross, a former legal secretary, contacted planning commission Chairman Herbert Herzberg.

Notices are going out from the planning commission to owners of property within a 800-foot radius of lots on which zone changes have been requested. The abutting property owners are being invited to participate in the discussion Wednesday, Nov. 5, at 8 p.m. in the Westwood village hall.

UP FOR review will be three zone change requests:

- 1) Rezoning of property on 14 Mile road between Pierce and Edgewood from present ERO (educational, research and office) to commercial. Siting hospital, of Detroit, owners of the property, seek the change to permit construction of a Shell oil company gas station there.
- 2) Rezoning of a 438-foot Southfield road frontage at the southwest corner of Beverly from residential to ERO, at the request of real estate agent, K.A.H. & S. Madonna.
- 3) Rezoning the southwest corner of 14 Mile and Southfield from residential to ERO to permit construction of a building for lease to the Wayne-Oakland bank. Request made by Knight-Wenard company.

Franklinites Ask Council to Vacate 2 Platted Roads

FRANKLIN—Nearly a dozen residents urged the planning commission to consider abolishing two sections of platted but undeveloped roads Monday night in an effort to install their eventual use for village traffic. The planners will review the arguments and make a recommendation later to the village council.

Requesting that Irving road between Normandy and Appletree lane, and Appletree lane and Colony Hill road be permanently vacated and stricken from the map, abutting residents maintained that these undeveloped roads constituted a nuisance and had no practical purpose.

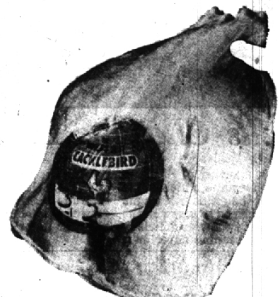
