

LWV Push Revision Campaign

Tuesday, November 4, will wind up a state-wide campaign by the League of Women Voters to get a "yes" vote on Constitutional Revision Proposal.

In Oakland County this will appear on the ballot as Proposal No. 1. The Birmingham League of Women Voters, as its contribution to the state effort, has acted in many directions.

Nearly 3,000 Birmingham area residents saw a skit written by the committee working on Constitutional Revision. Mrs. G. N. Hillinger, Chairman of the committee, not only acted in the 30 some presentations of the skit but also gave other short talks to smaller groups.

THE SKIT cast, consisting of: Mrs. Geo. Talbuth, Mrs. Alfred Krueger, Mrs. Roland Sawyer, Mrs. Geo. Malone, Mrs. Henry Jackson, Mrs. Lawrence Avison and Mrs. Howard Morgan. Mrs. William Estery and Mrs. William C. Davis were busy giving speeches with question periods.

Safety Rules For Halloween

Thousands of young Birmingham children will be piping "Trick or Treat" this Halloween night and too often their minds will be distracted from the dangers of crossing streets.

That's why the Birmingham Police department is urging both parents and drivers to be alert to the hazards that exist on this night of fun and gaiety.

"Halloween is a night when bedtime is moved back an hour or two, if the protests are long and loud enough—and little ones are allowed the unaccustomed privilege of roaming a dark street."

Chief Ralph W. Moxley said: "No one wants to spoil the youngsters' fun, but Halloween need not be a time of tragedy."

THE POLICE department offered these practical rules:

1. Parents should accompany children on their "Trick or Treat" trips. If this is impossible, another older son or daughter, at least in their teens, should accompany them.
2. Send the children to organized parties if possible, rather than allowing them to roam the streets.
3. Paint a mask on their faces instead of restricting their vision with a cloth or paper face mask.
4. Remind the children not to dash into the streets, particularly between parked cars.
5. Motorists should cut their speed on residential streets and be alert at all times for children even if they apparently are walking on

Officials 'Optimistic' After Talks with State

A four-man Birmingham delegation went to Lansing Tuesday with hopes flagging—and returned with optimism high. They had just been told by state highway department officials that everything possible will be done to relieve Birmingham's hazardous on-shoulder parking along US-10.

On his return, Mayor Carl F. Ingram said: "We left our (30 minute) meeting quite optimistically. We were favorably impressed with (the state's) intentions to relieve our situation."

MAKING THE trip with him were City Commissioner John S. O'Gorman, City Manager L. R. Gare and City Engineer Grover Serenbetsky.

They met with Engineering Deputy Howard E. Hill, Traffic Division Director Harold G. Bauer, and Regional Engineer Samuel Levine.

Ingram said the city outlined its concern over conditions as cars enter or leave the main traffic stream to park in front of Hunter and Woodward businesses.

THE STATE several years ago permitted the city to install some access drives as a traffic control device. Recently the highway department said it can no longer permit further drives until the availability of the sidewalk. One of them may dash suddenly into the street in front of your car.

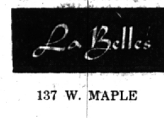

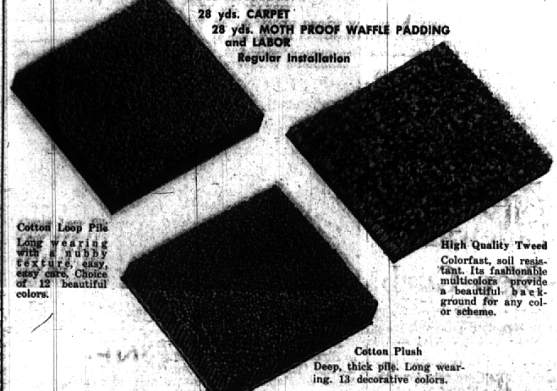
