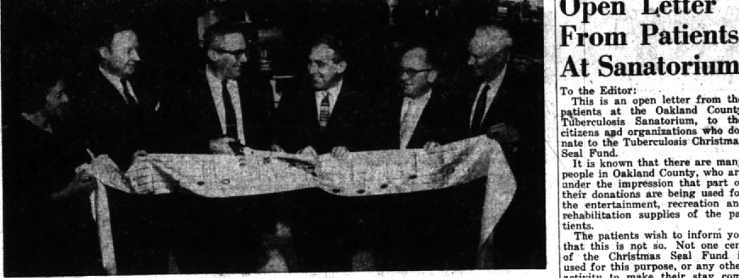

### Harry Merritt, County Counsel Dies at 62

Services for Harry J. Merritt, Oakland County corporation counsel for nearly 20 years, were Wednesday from the William Sullivan & Son funeral home. Burial was in White Chapel cemetery with the Rev. John Rose of Community Congregational church officiating.

Victim of a heart attack two weeks ago, Mr. Merritt, 62, died Sunday in William Beaumont hospital after another attack. He had undergone heart surgery Oct. 13, the date of his attack. It came only a few hours after the Board of Supervisors had appointed him to his twelfth year as the county's top legal advisor.

He is survived by his widow, Blossom M.; three children, Mrs. Robert Masters of Royal Oak; John G. Merritt, Southfield, and Virginia Louise, home of three grandchildren, and one brother, Maro Merritt of Royal Oak.

**BORN IN PONTIAC** Sept. 6, 1896, Merritt was a lifelong resident of Oakland county and a member of the Oakland County Bar association for more than 35 years. His home was at 1914 Woodward boulevard in Royal Oak, where he lived for more than 50 years.

He was graduated from Albion in 1919 and received his law degree in 1921 from Detroit College of Law. Before becoming corporation counsel in 1939, he was Royal Oak city attorney and a Circuit Court commissioner.

He was an organizer and life member of the Oakland County Sportsmen's club and an organizer of the Oakland County Hunt club. He was the American Legion's state treasurer in 1925 and past commander of the Frank Wendland Post 253 in Royal Oak. He was both a Shriner and a Mason.
