On the following kick-off, Bobbin Heaverich handed off to John Kingscott on his own 39, who then raced 70 yards to tie the score.

Mike Pricer ran for the point to put the Spartans ahead 7-6. Lindquist ran eight yards to score in the third quarter and Steve Bartholomew plunged two yards for the final score in the quarter.

The Hoosiers rolled to their third straight high-scoring victory, defeating the Bears, 34-13. Three Hoosiers tackled Dick Steiner in his own end zone for a safety in the first quarter. Blaine Wright passed eight yards to Bob Ford for a second-period score and Gary Bogdanski converted.

**IN THE LAST** quarter, Ford ran 60 yards on an end-around to score and Bob O'Brien ran three yards for the last touchdown. Geoffrey Smith ran for the final point.

The Gophers stayed in a three-way tie for third (\$2) in beating the Hawkeyes, 6-0. The only score of the game came early in the third quarter when Art Moore took an end-around and sped 52 yards to score.

The Buckeyes' undefeated record came to an end by a loss to the Indians, 18-7. Ken Evangelista, Indiana quarterback, scored all three Indian touchdowns on end runs.

All of the extra points were missed, but were not needed for the victory. The Buckeyes' fullback, Bill McCracken, scored on a 55-yard run in the second quarter and the point was scored by Bob Lindley.

**THE BOILERMAKERS** won their fourth game and first place in the Freshman Conference by decisively defeating the Wildcats, 26-0.
