

AAUW Sponsors 31st Annual Book Sale

A sale which makes available books for every member of the family, and books for institutions and books for library shelves in schools—is being presented again this month in Birmingham.

It is the 31st annual book sale sponsored by the American Association of University Women. The series opens Monday, Oct. 27 and runs through Oct. 31st.

OPEN every day from 9 a. m. to 5:30 p. m., evening hours will be on Monday and Thursday until 9 o'clock, giving business and working people a chance to browse through the more than 25,000 books available.

The sale, held in the Birmingham office of the Detroit Edison is a meeting ground for children eagerly searching the young people's section for a book they haven't read, high school students with an interest in music or hobby books, the butcher who dabbles in ceramics, the housewife who learns languages while she does her housework, and fiction and mystery lovers.
