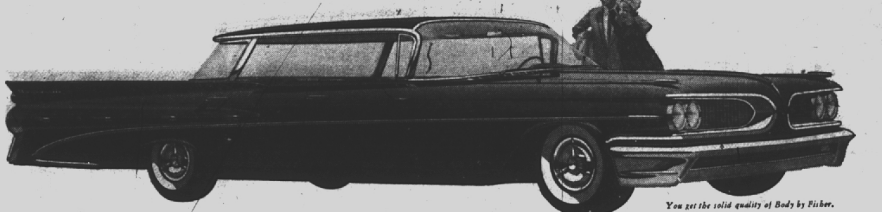
## Kappa Kappa Kappa Gamma Nominee for Queen

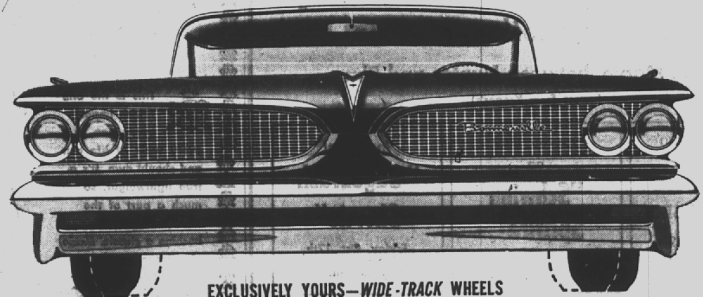
Margret, a junior, is a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority. She is majoring in secretarial and education.

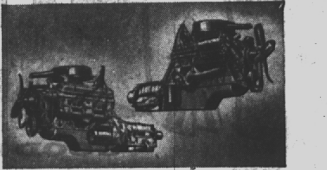
