### Wood Creek Farms Zone Hearing Oct. 21

WOOD CREEK FARMS—Proposed zoning regulations which will spell out various restrictions in the village of Wood Creek Farms are to be given a second public hearing, Oct. 21 at 8 p.m. at the St. Vincent-Sarah Fisher home on Inkster road.

Following the first meeting June 17, the council and members of the planning commission agreed to set a minimum lot size in an area which was originally referred as R-2.5, with lots as small as 25,000 square feet.

The planning commission was requested to consider opinions of residents who protested the plan, which was less than any existing lot in the village. Several councilmen also objected to the minimum, which is the equivalent of the "highest zoning in Farmington township.

WATSON KINNEY, chairman of the planning commission will present the revised version on Oct. 21 so that adoption may be considered by the council in November.

Title holders to large plots of undeveloped land near Middlebelt and 12 Mile road are expected to be affected by the proposed zoning. The Wood Creek council also prepared to make plans for next year's rubbish collection, Tuesday night. Harold Kutschke, now under contract with the Wood Creek Civic association to remove rubbish, will be contacted for a re-affirmation of his March quotation to the village.

The village will be responsible for rubbish removal after the first of next year. President Alger Clark stated that residents will be requested to provide certain type of container and be expected to keep their rubbish loads within reasonable limits.

WOOD CREEK may also have its own building inspection department. Charles Habermehl, former city of Farmington inspector, appeared before the council Tuesday to offer his services to complete inspections on building projects, issued permits by the village. Habermehl suggested the village might start to gain financially and inspections could be processed faster.
