

## Sculptor Has Big Projects

Projects come big for Marshall Fredericks.

The sculptor of the 9-ton bronze statue "Spirit of Detroit," erected this week in front of the Motor City's new city-county building, Fredericks is now completing two other major tasks.

One is a gigantic crucifixion group, 25 feet high, to be erected in April at a Catholic shrine at Indian River, Mich.

The other is a memorial fountain, due for completion next summer.

FREDERICKS, whose home is 575 Washington, Bloomfield, and whose office is at 4113 N. Woodward, Royal Oak, also is due to begin two other major projects.

One is the fountain for the National Exchange club headquarters in Toledo, the other a memorial fountain, due for completion next summer.

Fredericks worked three years on the "Spirit of Detroit," valued at \$40,000.

The statue, 20 feet high, is a huge figure of a man kneeling and holding a shining brass ball with spikes sticking out of it.

## Six Polio Cases Hit B'ham Area; Paralysis in 2

Of the 20 Oakland county cases of polio this year, six have been in the Birmingham area, the county department of health revealed this week. Two of them resulted in some paralysis.

Cases here include a 30-year-old Birmingham mother of six, who had not had polio vaccine and suffered paralysis. Others are a 25-year-old Birmingham man, non-paralytic, no vaccine; a 16-year-old Birmingham girl, non-paralytic, three shots; a 16-year-old Southfield girl, non-paralytic, three shots; and a 23-year-old Southfield man, non-paralytic, no vaccine.

First Oakland county polio case of the year was a 15-year-old Bloomfield township girl who suffered paralysis, but had had three shots.

...a city that tries to plan and develop without a sort of comprehensive or master plan will overlook opportunities and potential.

"A well-developed central business district encourages outside shopping centers. I think that at the present time Birmingham has something unique to offer shoppers. It has a central business district with character. There is something about it which attracts the shop-

"But there is only one way the city can guarantee that its central business district will remain attractive and able to compete with future competition. To do this it must have some sort of outline for future development as is offered under a comprehensive plan.

"EVERYTHING must be considered under this type of plan including traffic, parking facilities, public utilities and growth of outside areas. If these city planning factors that enter into the picture are not considered, then a city is bound to experience financial difficulties of its central business district."

Durden said the cost of a plan developed by his company usually ran between \$5,000 and \$7,000 depending on the amount of help the city and local planning board was able to offer.

Later in the week, Herbert Herzberg, Birmingham city planner expressed his feelings concerning a comprehensive plan.

"I SEE a drastic need for such a plan for the good of the city," Herzberg said. "Not only for the central business district, but for the whole city."

## Septic Tank Fails, Wendover Seeks Troy Council Aid

TROY — Demands for action to halt septic tank failures in Wendover subdivision were reiterated again Monday night by a group of the subdivision's residents.

They sought help from the city of Troy in forcing the developer, George Glover, to install sewer lines connecting the subdivision's sanitary sewer and the Evergreen Interceptor.

Troy officials instructed their city attorney to determine the developer's legal obligation to complete the connection.

THE RESIDENTS told the city that septic tanks now in use were temporary, and that the builder had agreed to complete the connection to the Evergreen. The line would have to go 1,300 feet through the subdivision.

HE WENT ON to compare the city to people, and a comprehensive plan to enable the city to plan for the future.

HERZBERG said the planning board would be able to use information contained in two other plans developed for the city in the past for designing a new comprehensive plan. These other plans were the Report of 1929 and the Barr Master Plan of 1950-51.

"There are many tables, charts and maps which are normally associated with a comprehensive plan that will be considered in the initial phases of our plan," Herzberg said.

"Only after we have completed our basic tabulation will we be able to know what consulting services we will need for an entire comprehensive plan program."

## Accident Record Shows Progress

Birmingham's accident record for the first eight months of this year shows a 10 percent improvement over the same period last year according to Police Chief Ralph W. Mosier.

There have been 276 accidents reported in the area so far this year with no deaths as compared to 243 accidents with two deaths last year.

Chief Mosier said that following too close was one of the main causes of traffic accidents. This violation was responsible for 105 of the 276 accidents reported.

Right-of-way violations and improper passing were responsible for 141 accidents.
