Franklin To Ask Road Suggestions From Residents

FRANKLIN — Residents are going to be asked many questions soon, and the answers may determine the kind of village roads Franklin will have in the future.

A proposed questionnaire was sent to the council last week by Donald Hogan, chairman for the special assessment study committee.

The questions will ask property owners whether gravel roads are preferred over hard-surfaced roads and if residents would be willing to be assessed to pay for major road improvements.

The committee and the council will also prepare a comprehensive report on costs and conditions to accompany the questionnaire.

This is not a vote, cautioned councilman Edward Green. "It is just a way to find out how people feel about their roads."

Results of the polling may put the road issue on the March ballot.

FRANKLIN — Franklin's fire department got the nod for a job well done from Frank E. Wickham, Meadowlake resident.

In a recent letter to the volunteers he said "Your prompt action and excellent fire-fighting ability were the determining factors in preventing considerable damage and loss at my home."

Wickham continued, "You saved my family a great deal of inconvenience and the insurance company several thousand dollars through your spontaneous and immediate response to my call for help."

ANOTHER REQUEST for help was made recently by the fire fighters themselves.

They noted that the \$15 contributions from residents within their protective radius has not been completely paid.

Approximately four per cent of the contributions made are used for salaries. The balance is spent on new equipment and operating expenses such as maintenance, telephone, gas and oil.

At present, funds are needed to build the new fire hall at the site of the former community hall.

Lathrup Paving Moves Step Nearer With Bond Approval

LATHRUP — In a phone call to Lansing at 4 p.m. Monday, City Clerk Jerome D. Stone learned that the Lathrup bond application for 1958 paving had been approved just minutes before.

Although close to \$11,000 has been collected in advance on the paving assessments, the work will have to be held up another two weeks until the Oct. 6 council meeting, when bids will be opened and the 1958 bonds sold.

Stone was asked by Mayor Rich and Cogger to investigate all possibilities of an early start on the paving. Cogger promised to call a special council meeting if necessary to get an earlier start.
