up the campers, the party spent several days at Silver Lake near Grand Haven.

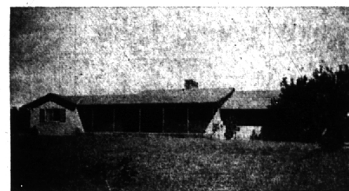

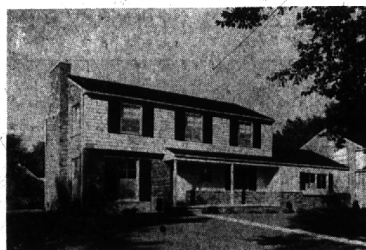
