For Camera Club

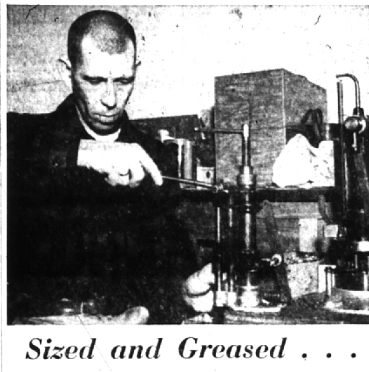
The Bloomfield Hills camera club presents Mr. Walter Nickell, naturalist, at tonight's meeting at Cranbrook institute of science auditorium.

Bullets Are Molded . . .

It won't be long now and the Birmingham police department's pistol range will be echoing with shots from many guns. Lt. Deyle Service (above) and Sgt. Richard E. Brown were busy recently reloading some of the 25,000 rounds the department uses each year. Lt. Service is pouring the molten lead into bullet forms.



Sized and Greased . . .

After the bullets cool, Sgt. Brown runs them through a sizing and greasing machine which trims off excess lead and coats them with gun lubricant. At the present time the pistol range is undergoing a \$3,500 improvement program. Paved runways and turning targets are some of the improvements.



Then Put Together . . .

Once the bullets are sized and greased, Sgt. Brown and Lt. Service use a reloading machine to put together the finished product. This machine punches the old primer out of the shell casing, inserts a new one, puts in the right amount of powder and places the lead bullet in the casing. Two men using the machine can produce 800 to 1,000 bullets an hour without any trouble.

Now the bullet is completely reloaded and ready for firing. Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley said the department saves 60 cents a box by reloading their own shells. There are 50 shells to a box. The reloads are not as dependable as factory-loaded ammunition, so officers use the factory loads in their pistols while on duty.

Accidents Show Marked Increase

Automobile accidents, injuries and costs increased in March and the first quarter of 1959. Chief of Police Ralph W. Moxley announced.

The first three months of 1959 saw a total of 185 automobile accidents, "a substantial increase over the same period in 1958," the chief said. There were 132 accidents in 1958's first quarter.

The number of personal injuries jumped from 29 last year, to 42 this year. The estimated \$53,270 in property damage was \$17,000 higher than last year.

The accident total for March was 52, four more than February's total, and much higher than the 39 accidents recorded in March, 1958.

Property damage costs were nearly double the February figure.
