Bullets Are Molded . . .

It won't be long now and the Birmingham police department's pistol range will be echoing with shots from many guns. Lt. Delyle Service (above) and Sgt. Richard E. Brown were busy recently reloading some of the 25,000 rounds the department uses each year. Lt. Service is pouring the molten lead into bullet forms



Sized and Greased . . .

After the bullets cool, Sgt. Brown runs them through a sizing and greasing machine which trims off excess lead and coats them with gun lubricant. At the present time the pistol range is undergoing a \$3,500 improvement pro-gram. Paved runways and turning targets are some of



Then Put Together .

Once the bullets are sized and greased, Sgt. Brown and Lt. Service use a reloading machine to put together the finished product. This machine punches the old primer out of the shell casing, inserts a new one, puts in the right amount of powder and places the lead bullet in the casing. Two men using the machine can produce 800 to 1,000 bullets an hour without any trouble.



Now the bullet is completely reloaded and ready for fir-ing. Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley said the department saves 60 cents a box by reloading their own shells. There are 50 shells to a box. The reloads are not as dependable as factory-loaded ammunition, so officers use the factory
