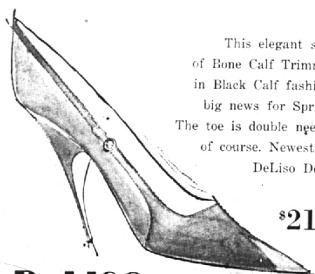
James Kerr Pollock, Ph.D., chairman, political science department, University of Michigan, will discuss "The Berlin Situation. Its Prospects and Implications."

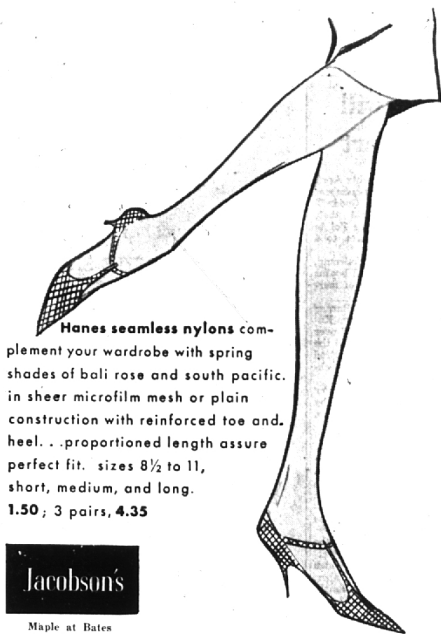
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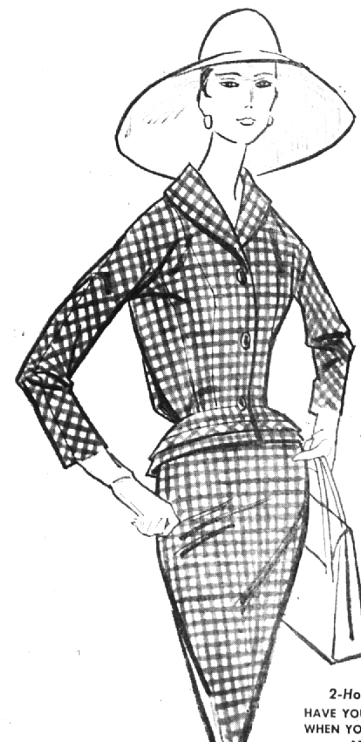
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
