## Kinseys Charter Jet For European Tour

Two years ago after the John Kinseys of Hylane drive returned from another of their intriguing trips abroad and their friends gathered as usual to hear of their exciting travels, an idea was born. The friends no longer wanted to listen—they wanted to go along!

So on Saturday 71 persons, after two years of planning, are boarding a chartered jet at the Metropolitan airport, with the Kinseys for a three week "Kinsey tour" of Europe.

Paris will be the first stop on the itinerary, followed with the scenic beauty of the Riviera before going on to Rome, Florence, Venice and Lucerne, Switzerland will also be visited, Heidelberg, Germany, Amsterdam and Brussels will bring to a close an eventful three weeks for the group. They and the John Kinseys will then part company in Amsterdam as the group leaves for London and home on May 7.

The Kinseys will fly on to the Far East via the North Pole on the second half of their trip. They will make stops at Anchorage, Alaska, and the Aleutian Islands before arriving in Tokyo, Japan on May 8. Kinsey is with an export firm and will spend some time in Tokyo. Many of the people they are visiting have also visited the Kinseys in the States.

The journey will take them on to Manila, Hong Kong and Australia. Their plans include a five day stay in the Fiji Islands, the Hawaiian Islands, and four days in Los Angeles before arriving back home on July 1.

Among those accompanying them on the first part of the trip will be Mr. and Mrs. Don Rothang, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Ledrove, and Mrs. A. D. Sheldon of Birmingham. Frank Simson of Detroit, Kinsey's father, will be bringing down the Hylane drive home fronts with the help of the Kinseys' kittens during their absence.
