BLOOMFIELD HILLS—Bloomfield Hills voters will cast ballots for three city commissioners, a constable, four proposals, state and circuit court positions and the state ballot on various educational positions in Monday's election.

Bloomfield Hills city commissioners John S. Bugas, Lyman J. Craig and Dominick Vetrinno are unopposed in their bid for re-election as is constable Homer J. Murphy.

LOCAL VOTERS will also be asked to confirm the grant of franchise to the Detroit Edison company to erect, construct, lay, operate and maintain necessary equipment within the city limits.

BITS OF BIRMINGHAM

In newrooms of most Michigan newspapers, there is no question of how to spell the name of a retired Detroit News official and longtime Birmingham resident. The man's name is spelled Lee A.
