Birmingham city commissioners have declared necessity for two paving projects, but postponed hearings on two others after lis-tening to the opinions of several residents.

The projects declared a necessity were the paving of Frank street from Woodward to Ann, and the Ann-Landon pavement.

A third paving project, Landon-Purdy-Ann, met with opposition from some residents and home own-ers, while others were in favor of the project.

## **Motorists Warned** Not to Leave Keys In Automobiles

An increase in the number of tickets for leaving keys in the ignition, or leaving the ignition in an unlocked position brought words of warning from Birmingham po-lice Lt. Robert Schaule this week.

lice Lt. Robert Schaule this week. Schaule said these two violations were the contributing factors for the high rate of auto theft in this area, which has increased 30 per cent in the last three years. He pointed out that most auto thefts are committed by juvenited and leaving keys in the car, or the ignition in an unlocked position just made it easier for the thief.

"THESE TWO offenses are inviolation of the city's traffic or-dinance," said Schaule.
