

Candidate Announces Platform

Claude L. Kidd, Jr., 2616 Dorchester, candidate for the unexpired one-year term on the city commission, announced his platform to The Birmingham Eccentric this week.

Kidd will face William T. Burdum, 1878 Winthrop, who was appointed to the vacancy last July.

THE MERCHANTISE manager of the F. J. Mulholland department store, Kidd has lived in Birmingham for the last six years and is a member of the Lions club and past president of the Birmingham junior chamber of commerce.

In announcing his platform, Kidd said:

Traffic studies should be made to determine how we can alleviate our heavy traffic flow.

One of our main thoughts should be to divert traffic from Maple road. We should consider additional one-way streets to facilitate better traffic flow.

Continue long range planning to create and maintain Birmingham as a modern shopping center.

Develop our central business district. A large percentage of the central district is vacant land. Increase municipal parking lots. Northwest quadrant is in need of municipal parking.

Future projects should be checked closer to include all necessary improvements.

Parking should be included on the proposed library addition. Ample land is available adjacent to the library to allow parking. The library needs more exterior lighting.

Many of our main arterial streets need improvement but the city should take a greater degree of participation. Lincoln and 11 Mile should be widened.

The rezoning of any more property to multiple family dwelling should be stopped.

Our multiple family ratio to single family is out of balance. Encroachment by multiple family on single family endangers the valuation of single family.


