More than one Michigan School District, More than one Michigan School District, especially in urban areas, has found it increasingly difficult to get sufficient tax money with which to carry on its educational system. This condition is caused largely by a sort of taxpayers' rebellion against the ever increasing over-all tax load, beginning with the federal government's tremendous demands on the average person's income right on down through State and local governmental units.

Another important factor exists in the belief by many taxpayers that some boards of education are spending too much money on school buildings. Bloomfield Hills School District, after two tries, finally won the approval of a majority of its taxpayers to increase the district's millage and the right to issue bonds to pay for a new school building.

Just a few days ago, down in Royal Oak, the voters rejected similar financial demands made by the Royal Oak School District. Of course, Royal Oak will have another election and perhaps the estimated

cost of some of the buildings it needs may be lowered by revamping the plans and the substitution of less costly materials.

IN SCHOOL districts where the taxpayers have had to finance and build many new schools, with consequent rapid in-crease in their taxes, they have been more reluctant to approve further school ex-penditures. Some districts have, like the Hills, had to submit financing propositions several times, lowering the amount in many cases, in order finally to win voter

approval.

The Birmingham school district, too The Birmingham school district, too, may find it more difficult in the future to raise the tax millage and win public support for anything except a very economically designed and constructed school plant. "After all," believe many parents and taxpayers, "we're perfectly willing to provide suitable school buildings, but we also feel a deep obligation to pay our teachers sufficient money so that we may get the best possible instruction for our children."
