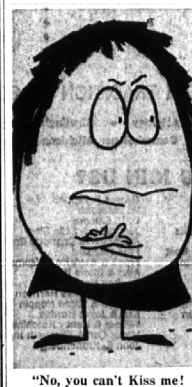
MUNICIPAL JUDGE

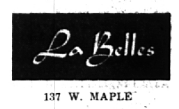
