Hills Schools Shape Budget, Eye Pay Raises

BLOOMFIELD HILLS — A teachers' salary schedule committee-discussed pay with the Bloomfield Hills board of education in a special meeting last week.

A decision on the teacher pay raise request will precede formulation of the school district's '59-'60 budget. School Superintendent Eugene L. Johnson said the board had available \$6 mill for salary adjustments. He said the board felt "perhaps" they are obligated to use that money "not only for teachers, but for all school personnel."

The board will meet again next week to discuss the teachers' request for higher annual increment raises beyond the first-year salary of \$4600.

PREPARING the schools' '59-'60 budget under existing uncertainties about state and county school allocations is "like putting some figures together in the dark," Johnson said last week.

Speculating on monies to be allocated schools by the state, Johnson was pessimistic.

"We are putting our budget out based on a gloomy state picture," he said.

AS FAR as the percentage of Oakland county tax receipts to be made available to schools by the Oakland county allocation board, Johnson said he could only "hope for the best."
