## Free Garden Clinic April 8

The cafeteria in the new Bloomfield Hills junior high school, 4200 Garden road, will be the scene, at 8 p.m., on April 8, of a garden clinic, sponsored jointly by the Detroit Times and the cooperative extension services of Michigan State university in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties. The meeting, which has "Garden Easily" for its theme, will be conducted by Lyle Abel, Oakland county extension director. He also will speak on "Plants Which Help You Garden Easily." Oakland county horticultural agent Wayne Sigfert, will tell about "Chemicals Which Help You Garden Easily" while Charles Gale, superintendent of forestry and parks for Birmingham, will discuss "Garden Processes Which Help You Garden Easily." Following the hour-long program, there will be a drawing for the plants, tools and gadgets used during the clinic. Name and address on the back of a ticket dropped into the big flower pot at the entrance to the clinic will guarantee a chance to take home one of these prizes. Following the drawing, the speakers, plus a panel of experts, will come into the audience to answer questions and help with individual garden problems. Armiger of Southfield township has gardened extensively for 20 years, specializes in growing rare plants from seed, is a judge for the American Fern Society. She will help with shrub problems. 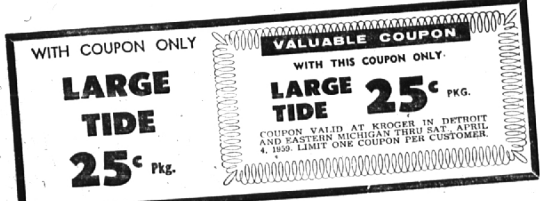

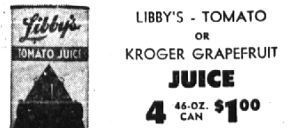
