BUSINESS BRIEFS

Government to Collect \$16 Million in Taxes

NEW YORK, April 6 — How much will Uncle Sam be collecting in the form of individual income taxes, from residents of Birmingham this year?
The government anticipates that it will be more than it was last year, when local income and employment taxes came to approximately \$15,998,000.
THE FIGURE, an unofficial estimate, is based on a breakdown of the statewide total announced by the Treasury department and

on local earnings and income distributions.
The returns from Birmingham represent 0.60 per cent of the amount garnered from the state as a whole.
Nationally, the government looks for the payments now being made to be \$2.2 billion greater than they were last year. This budgetary increase reflects an average rise in income amounting to 2.8 per cent.
ASSUMING a proportionate rise locally, the current returns from individuals in Birmingham will be about \$16,446,000.
According to the president's new budget, a further increase in personal income taxes will occur in 1960. The boost expected is over \$3 billion.
It is to result from bigger incomes in 1959 and from an increase in employment taxes.
The total take from individuals through income and employment taxes alone, would then exceed \$50 billion, a historic peak.
To keep pace with this budgetary planning and to continue bearing their present portion of the tax burden, Birmingham residents would have to raise their combined pay by approximately 5.8 per cent in the year.

A STUDY by the Tax Foundation discloses that the U. S. Government is presently spending at the enormous rate of \$300 million per day, over \$2.5 billion per week. Expenditures in 1958 were \$1 billion above the 1957 total, and those, in turn, were \$11 billion over the 1956 outlay.
The Federal tax take, to meet these expenses, is now running at \$77 billion a year. State and local governments get an additional \$32 billion.
One-fourth of our gross annual product is thus removed in taxes, states the Foundation.

The new builders division will enable the company to assist buyers with construction and mortgage financing.

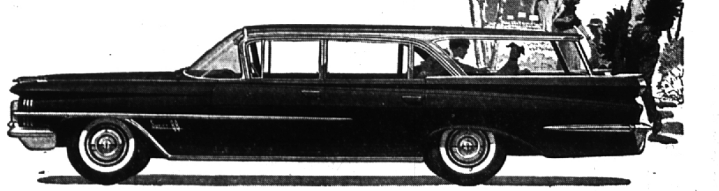
Slate Antique Show
