Two-Foot Carp Wins For 13-Year-Old Boy

"Another half-inch and it would have been two feet long."

This was the way 13-year-old Robert Almond, 16991 Birwood, described his prize-winning carp he hauled out of Quorton Lake Saturday in the Recreation department's carp carnival.

The 5 1/2 pound fish was 23 1/2 inches long and it took Bob nearly 20 minutes to bring it ashore.

TOM WHALEY, 476 Catalpa, Royal Oak, caught the largest number of fish in the 30-14 age group and Scott Cameron, 710 Surfside, caught the longest fish for boys 12 and under with a 15 1/2 inch carp.

The most fish caught by a boy 12 and under was won by Steve Wehl, 1065 Puritan, and Jane Adams, 31750 Eastlady, was the only double winner of the day.

Miss Adams won with a fish 23 1/2 inches long and also won the most fish caught prize with three.

JOHN CUMMINGS, 989 Kenesaw, won the most unusual fishing equipment ribbon by using a four-foot tree branch with six feet of line attached to it. He used a standard nylon leader with hook attached.

Janelle Severy, 31725 Eastlady, also used a tree branch, but was slightly more imaginative. The forked branch had a line attached to each limb and eye hooks were used as guides for the line.

THE YOUNGEST boy fisherman was Matt Wrobley, 3185 Longmeadow, 12, and the youngest girl at the carnival was Libby Howes, 315 More than 200 youngsters entered the carp carnival this year and N. Glenhurst, 2, was the largest field of entrants in the history of the annual affair, according to Recreation department Director Robert Girardin.
