2 Killed In Traffic Accidents

Death on the highway skirted Birmingham borders over the weekend. Automobile accidents took the lives of a local woman, and a Royal Oak man and hospitalized a Birmingham woman.

Mrs. Ida LaFleur, 47, of 5510 Putnam, Walnut Lake, died early Sunday morning in Mt. Carmel hospital, Detroit, of a skull fracture.

Mrs. LaFleur was struck by a car while crossing Livernois ave. near Seven Mile road. She died about an hour later.

SHE WAS STRUCK by a car driven by Ronald L. McKetrick, a University of Detroit engineering sophomore.

Witnesses said Mrs. LaFleur stepped into the car's path; McKetrick was not held.

Funeral services Tuesday at the Burgh funeral home, Detroit, preceded the 11 a.m. Mass at Holy Name church, Birmingham. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre cemetery.

MRS. LAFLEUR is survived by her husband, Leo; her father, Everett Bergeron, of the Putnam address; a son, Gilbert, of Detroit, and 10 brothers and sisters.

A Royal Oak man was killed, and a Birmingham woman seriously injured in an accident at Woodward and 14 Mile road, early the same morning.

Cass L. Milo, 34, of 4622 Mandalay, Royal Oak, was declared dead on admission to William Beaumont hospital.
