Roadoling special assessment rolls—with necessary deletions or changes because of a May 11 necessity hearing—will be confirmed a week later at a May 15 public hearing. The assessments involve more than 10 miles of streets.
Only one notice of hearing will go to property owners the committee decided, thus saving mailing of thousands of additional notices.
Costs will be on a front foot basis, and at the same rates as last year: 15 cents for light oil, 52 cents for mat and seal, and 24 cents for seal coat.
