1959 ROAD OIL PROGRAM—OIL MAT & SEAL COAT

The City Commission of the City of Birmingham will meet Monday, May 11, 1959, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commission Room in the Municipal Building to consider any objections to the construction of certain improvements on streets as listed below and to the creation of a special assessment district, created to defray the cost of construction of:

An improvement to be hereafter known as: 1959 ROAD OIL PROGRAM—OIL MAT & SEAL COAT consisting of re-surfacing the existing surface into an oil mat, followed with two applications of asphaltic oil and stone chips to the following streets:

The Commission proposes to create a special assessment district to defray the cost of this construction and said special assessment district shall consist of the following described property:

"Properties fronting or abutting on the proposed improvement." Plans and estimate of cost of this project are filed with the City Clerk of the City of Birmingham for examination by the public. Individual assessments are not now available. They will be computed by the Assessor after May 11, 1959, if the necessity for this improvement is established by the Commission, and there will be another public hearing scheduled for the purpose of reviewing an assessment. Estimated cost—\$9.52 per front foot.

WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT:



Note to readers: Thanks for all the nice letters. As many questions as possible will be answered in this column, but for obvious reasons replies must be brief.

Q. "I am not too good at asking questions but I'll try. I am 23 and seem to have trouble getting enough air, I sometimes wake at night feeling that I can't breathe and it frightens me. Does this sound like heart trouble?"—Mrs. C.

A. Shortness of breath upon exertion is one symptom of possible heart trouble. There are many other symptoms, including heart skips, rapid pulse, indigestion, chest pain and fainting spells. Mull over this list. Maybe you have one or more such complaints. But don't jump to conclusions. Let your doctor decide. One person may have all of the above symptoms (and more) and not have heart trouble.

Q. "What causes a microcephalic baby?"—R. N.

A. The most common cause is "nervous habit." The blinking may start with some local eye condition and continue as a habit. If there is nothing basically wrong (and this can be determined only by a doctor), every effort should be made to ignore the habit.

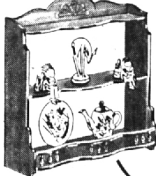

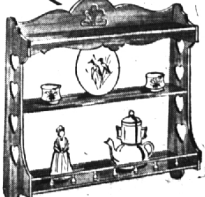

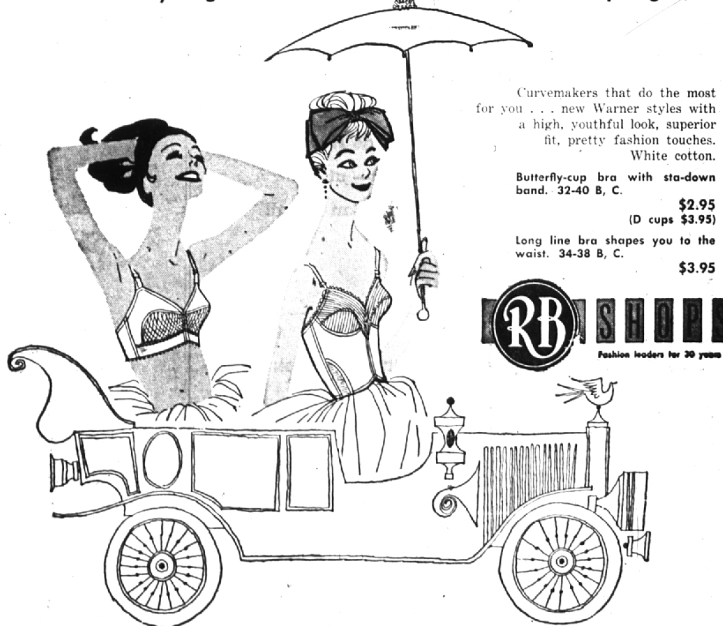
