

### 3 N. Adams Churches Plan Canvass of Area

The three churches of the North Adams road community have planned a canvass during May to determine the religious affiliation of the residents of that community.

Participating in the canvass will be Beautiful Saviour Lutheran church on North Adams road, Northminster Presbyterian church on Big Beaver road, and St. Stephen's Episcopal church, west in Eastover school on Westview road.

A COMMITTEE COMPOSED of members from all three churches and their pastors met recently to plan the canvass. The area to be covered is bordered by South Blvd. on the north, Spurred road and Kensington road on the west, Big Beaver road and Maple road (east of North Adams) on the south, and Coalinge road on the east.

This area has been divided into three sections, each to be the canvass area for one of the churches. The churches will then share the results of the canvass.

INSTRUCTIONAL MEETINGS are being planned by the participating churches to acquaint the canvassers with the information to be requested from the residents.

In planning the canvass all three churches expressed their responsibility to serve the residents of this community. The rapidly increasing number of homes in the area together with the mobility of the population make it difficult for the churches to effectively serve this area of responsibility.
