perintendents, he must draw up a budget with no concrete figures to work with.

Law requires these budgets to be turned over to the tax allocation board by April 20, but Dr. Ireland was given a day of grace because the school board does not meet until the 21st.

Dr. Ireland said he didn't know how much state aid the system would receive for the 1959-60 school year because there are four state aid proposals in the legislature.

A reduction in state aid will mean a reduction in operating funds.

To further complicate matters, he must plan on getting full state aid in making his budget. Dr. Ireland said the system has only received three-quarters of its state aid this year and that he doesn't expect the remainder by the close of the fiscal year.

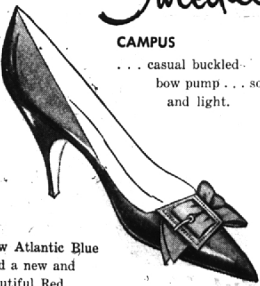

Lew Betterly to Open New B'ham Music Store

Under the name of "Lew Betterly—Organs & Pianos", a new Birmingham music store will be opened at 240 S. Woodward Friday, April 17.

Using as a slogan the familiar: "There's music in the air", the new addition to this area's music outlets will bring together two of Detroit's well known organists and close friends, Lew Betterly, of nearby Devon on Gilbert Lake, and Ole Foersch, 32351 Haverford Dr., Franklin Village.

Betterly is proprietor, while Foersch, for 30 years was director of music for radio station WWJ, and previous to that director of the Woodward Players, of Detroit. He will teach organ daily at Betterly's.

"OUR STORE will handle, exclusively in this area, Conn organs and Story & Clark pianos," said Betterly this week. "We plan to give music lovers the very best in instruments, and to aid in developing a greater appreciation of the spiritual values that good music provides for people."

Betterly, a Detroit pioneer in the introduction and sale of several well known organs and pianos, himself is an outstanding organist.

"Both Mr. Foersch and I have them at times, played the large organs in several of Detroit's movie theaters years ago, including the Michigan, Capitol, State, R.K.O., and Royal Oak. Betterly also played the organ over radio stations WXYZ and WEXL.

FOERCH has been organist for the programs put on by the Detroit Council of Churches for 18 years, and teaches composition of music for radio and TV at Wayne University.

His wife is an accomplished concert pianist, and former pupil of David Bispham, nationally known baritone of the 'Twenties.

didn't get through voting until 8:30. Then absentee ballots had to be put into the machines.

"This was an unusually long ballot this year," she said. "People were taking as long as five minutes to vote."

Birmingham's favorite son, former mayor and city commissioner, James C. Allen, placed fourth in the city's balloting for Oakland county circuit judges. But in the county, he headed the five losers. He was 19,989 behind Royal Oak attorney Stanton G. Dondoro, who was the fifth of the winning candidates.

OTHER COUNTY judgeship winners were incumbents H. Russell Holland, J. Clark Adams, William Beer, and County Prosecutor Fred Ziem.

William H. Baldwin of Bloomfield township ran a poor third in the state supreme court race. Incumbents George Edwards and John Voelker were returned with 515,583 and 433,938 respectively. Baldwin pulled 251,444 votes.

As in most areas, Birmingham's state vote received the heaviest percentage of votes cast. Top running University of Michigan regents candidate Fred Matthei received 4,216 of the 5,129 votes cast. The vote dropped to 3,719.
