It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any person, knowingly, to file, or cause to be filed, an application containing one or more false statements.

The Village Clerk shall authorize the permit provided for in Section 201 hereof whenever he shall find the following facts to exist a matter of fact, engaged in charitable, patrotic, civic, educational, philanthropic or religious purposes.

(a) That none of the proceeds derived from the solicitations authorized under the permit shall be used exclusively for charitable, civic, educational, patrotic, philanthropic or religious purposes.
