10 B'ham Streets To Receive New Blacktop Surfaces

A \$55,400 asphaltic street re-surfacing program is planned for this summer, Birmingham City En-gineer Grover Serenbetz has re-ported to the city commission. He said an additional \$41,200 would be spert on the present strip pavements when portions of Eton and Lincoln widened.
