1st Baptist Pastor To Give Readings From Bible

"Readings from the Bible and Comments" will highlight the week services at the First Baptist church on Wednesday evenings at 8 during April and May.

The new minister, Homer J. Armstrong, will be reading from "Letters to Young Churches" by J. B. Phillips, and will make comments on the Testament books.

"Many modern Christians," says Dr. Armstrong, "feel that it is difficult if not impossible to be a real Christian in this Twentieth Century, especially during our times. These New Testament studies will show that there is no better time to be a Christian than now, that no one has to wait for better times before the Christian religion can be lived."

"The Beginning" is the April topic and four major subjects will be discussed: God (last Sunday), Christ (this Sunday), the Church and the Christian in the weeks following. The May series is entitled "Close-Ups of the Galleian."
