Library Prepares For National Library Week

Along with preparing for the forthcoming building addition project, Baldwin public library is completing plans for its second annual observance of National Library Week, scheduled for April 12th through 18th.

According to Miss Jeanne Lloyd, Librarian, this year will bring special exhibits, the appearance of Girl Scout hostesses, and the premiere showing of a new motion picture filmed in the Baldwin library.

Not only special book displays have been arranged but also an exhibit of black and white prints made by Miss Roxane Lambie, local photographer.

MISS LAMBIE'S pictures of children will be featured in the frieze surrounding the boys' and girls' department, while a collection of her photographs based on a theme of "Suddenly It's Spring" will be placed in the reference alcove.

Using the occasion to aid them in fulfilling work for the Reader's Badge, the Girl Scouts of Troop 495, directed by Olive Rodgers, will act as library hostesses for the next two Saturdays, April 17th and 18th.

The library will distribute bookmarks and, on April 18th, will guide patrons to the library auditorium for showings of the movie.

A 16 MILLIMETER color film, made by Charles Gale, parks and forestry superintendent for Birmingham, will give viewers a behind-the-scenes look at library operations and show the diversity of services available to Baldwin library patrons. Complete with scripted narration, it will be presented at hourly intervals Saturday, April 18th.

National Library Week will be featured by TV and radio stations, and also by the nation's magazines. William T. Gossett of Bloomfield Hills is State chairman for National Library Week which is a project of the National Book Committee, Inc., in cooperation with the American Library Association.
