# Southfield OKs Water Proposal

**SOUTHFIELD** — Voters in the city of Southfield passed, by an overwhelming majority, the proposal to purchase its own public water supply system from Southfield township. The vote makes possible the split of the water system between Beverly Hills and the city.

At the same time, Southfield voters rejected by a narrow margin a second proposal on the ballot—the purchase of a major park site through a \$375,000 bond issue. The issues were decided by 43 percent of the electorate. Out of approximately 8,424 registered voters, 3822 ballots were cast.

**PURCHASE** of the water system was carried by a vote of 2375 to 926.

With 1863 votes cast in favor of purchasing a future park site and 1470 votes against it, the issue failed by 136 votes to gain the 50 per cent needed to carry it.
