Rezoning Battle Continues in S'field

SOUTHFIELD—A public hearing to consider rezoning frontage on Southfield road just north of 12 Mile will be set this week by city officials.

Lieberwitz-Lezell, a Detroit development firm, has been trying for two years to get the property involved changed from residential to shopping center use. A million and a half dollar 14-store center is planned for the land.

The company contends that the deed restrictions governing the land were broken a few years ago when residents allowed construction of a drug store on the northwest corner of Southfield and 12 Mile road.

Dust Control Plan Offered to Residents
