(Continued from Page 1-E) the money over to the county, and "they spend it for us." The approximately 155 miles of secondary roads are county-owned, and Oakland county last year budgeted \$48,000 for their maintenance. The township's half-million supplemented the amount with \$42,000. Other Oakland county townships have voted supplementary road funds.

"I think it's been worth the half-million," Hulet said, noting improvement, "although I am not happy about the way we can spend it."

REPORTING on sewage problems, Homer Case said the \$300 connecting charge was expected to pay the township's share of the big Evergreen interceptor project which will carry sewage to Detroit for treatment. When the Evergreen is completed in about a year, Case said it would clear the way for hundreds of township residents to have sanitary sewers. He predicted special assessments would be set up by subdivisions to finance installation of lateral lines to the Evergreen.

A breakdown of the budget, passed on a motion from Bloomfield village volunteer fire chief William H. Spinning, includes: building department, \$21,200; treasurer's department, \$22,000; clerk's department, \$10,800; general fund, including insurance, \$5,000; local fees and \$20,000 salaries, \$48,100; police, \$66,200; and fire, \$66,500.

The road commissioner directs the operations of the village road contractor, Berkeley asphalt company. Under direction of the village council, he is responsible for the expenditure of all state monies returned to the village for roads, about a \$50,000 program. THE COMMISSIONER makes decisions as to where resources available for roads will be diverted. He receives a considerable number of calls about trouble spots, Reed said, adding that the job takes "quite a bit of time."
