Maple Road Reading Room Serves Birmingham Area

Nestled in a building at 365 Maple road the Christian Science Reading Room for the First Church of Christ Scientist, Birmingham, offers a quiet contrast to the downtown bustle and bustle all around it.

The many window panes, the old fashioned furniture and the rows of books set a quiet and attractive atmosphere for reading and study.

The King James version of the Bible, the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health" by Mary Baker Eddy, and many other books and periodicals sold by the Christian Science Publishing society in Boston, may be read, borrowed and purchased.

In addition, the Birmingham Reading Room has an unusual collection of Christian Science Journals and Christian Science Sentinels which date back to the first issue of each.

For extended study and research Bible histories, dictionaries, and concordances for both the Bible and the writings of Mary Baker Eddy are provided. The Christian Science Monitor is available for reading and for sale.

The display windows of the reading room are planned with an arrangement of books which comprise the weekly lesson-sermon as outlined in the Christian Science Quarterly.

A librarian is always in attendance. Mrs. Adele Fisk, 1220 E. Maple, has been the librarian at the Birmingham room for many years.

The Birmingham reading room has been at its present location since 1948 when it moved from the church edifice closer to the business area to better serve the community.

The Christian Science church was first established in the city in June 1918 in the old Birmingham Club at 148 S. Woodward which they bought and remodeled as a church with a reading room in the front.

In 1927 when the church was built, the reading room was moved to the edifice of the new church before the final move to its new Maple avenue location.

The first reading room was established in 1888 at the Hotel Baylson, Boston, Mass., and served as a meeting place for Mary Baker Eddy's pupils, as well as an office for the Christian Science Journal.

Now each branch church of the First Church of Christ Scientist has a reading room.
