Rev. Hodgson Warns: Don't Invite Disaster from Polio

"Thousands of persons in Oakland County are inviting disaster," warned the Rev. G. Burton Hodgson, of Birmingham, chairman of the Oakland county chapter of The National Foundation, "if they continue to neglect vaccination against polio."
Mr. Hodgson referred to the situation in Des Moines, Iowa, where, he said, a polio epidemic is now raging in full force. "Here's a city," he added, "where large numbers of people never got their Salk shots because they thought it was too much trouble. Now look at the trouble they're in. The toll of persons stricken in Des Moines is mounting rapidly, and there have already been some deaths reported."

The National Foundation, Mr. Hodgson said, was rushing nurses and other medical personnel and a great deal of special equipment to the Des Moines area to help meet their emergency. In addition, The National Foundation has dispatched special personnel and equipment to other polio outbreak points in Oklahoma City, Kansas City, Dallas, Fort Worth, Nashville, New Orleans, and Chapel Hill, N. C.
"WHEN YOU consider," Mr. Hodgson said, "that polio has struck recently in those widely scattered areas, is there any person who Oakland County should feel safe? We might be next, and if we are, the responsibility will lie with those people in our community who have not been inoculated." He added that some public health officials predicted that by the end of this summer polio will reach its highest peak since 1955, the year the Salk vaccine was developed.

Wayne and U of M Offer Adult Education Courses

More than 100 courses will be offered this fall by the division of adult education of Wayne state university and the University of Michigan.
The division, which combines the resources of the two universities, enrolled more than 5,000 adults during the academic year 1958-59. A wide variety of courses ranging from the liberal arts and the humanities to business subjects will be offered.
Faculty from both universities will be used to teach the courses held on the Wayne State campus as well as at the Rackham Memorial and at six suburban points which include Allen Park, Farmdale, Grosse Pointe, Royal Oak, St. Clair Shores and Wyandotte.
The number of afternoon classes will also be enlarged this fall. Nine courses, primarily in the liberal arts, will be offered from 1:30 p.m. until 3:00 p.m. during the fall semester. All classes, except one in French, will meet one afternoon a week for eight weeks in the cultural center area.
INDIVIDUALS interested in the liberal arts and the humanities may enroll in courses in art, economics, music, literature, history, foreign languages, psychology, philosophy, and sociology and anthropology. Self-improvement classes include English grammar, vocabulary improvement, public speaking, voice, and language improvement, and creative writing.
Business subjects offered this fall include accounting, electronic data processing, insurance, business correspondence, business law, credits and collections, office management, salesmanship, and advertising.
Wayne state university's department of home economics will offer courses in creative home management, knitting, needlework and wardrobe construction and management. The audio-visual department courses in photography; department at Wayne will also sponsor in home movies and the club in color slide photography.

FACULTY OF the University of Michigan will participate in three lecture series. "Biological Forces in the World of Man" will be held in the Rackham Building in Detroit while "Great Religions of the World" will be held in Royal Oak. A new technical series on Space Technology given by faculty of the University of Michigan will be sponsored by the Division in the Dearborn Center of the University of Michigan.
Catalogues for the fall semester will be ready for mailing within the next few days. Requests for information can be directed to the Division of Adult Education at the Dearborn building, 60 Pershing Road, Detroit 2, Mich.
Registration opens on Monday, Sept. 14 and continues through Saturday, Sept. 19. Classes begin on Monday, Sept. 21. The fee for most courses is \$20.00.
