The programs will follow each Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday through Aug. 30 under Valter Poole's direction.

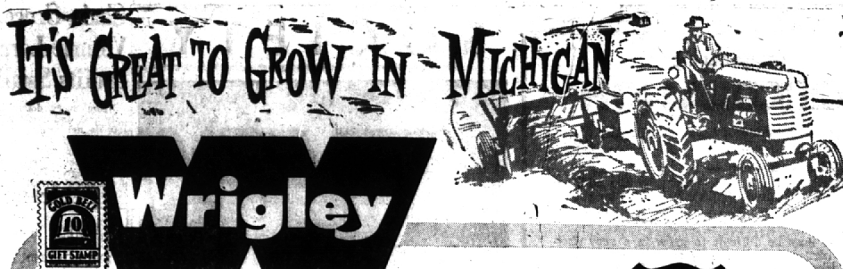
