Cline commented, "we would cease to have a reasonable ordinance if requirements were in excess of the present stipulations of 16,000 square feet and the 100-foot frontage."

ANOTHER resident questioned the subdividers about water provisions. The developers plan to use one well site for all the 40 proposed homes. Lathrup area residents were concerned about a lowering of the water level due to one large well in the vicinity.

Walter Denison, Nottingham Forest developers' counsel, told the residents that the county and the village set requirements regarding wells. "We're abiding by those regulations," he said.

COUNCILMAN Hugh G. Allerton, Jr., will meet with the planners and residents on the development of the strip of property from the subdivision to Lathrup road, bounded by established residents. President Cline assured the residents after the proposed plan was approved that the council would watch the proceedings of the development carefully.

building code states "it shall be unlawful to connect eavestroughs, house gutters, down spouts, patio and courtyard drains, and other similar devices for the channeling of rain water... to any sewer, sanitary or combined... within the township of Bloomfield."

THE AMENDMENT was tabled after opposition to it developed from township trustees, Robert Reid. Reid objected to the cost of removing such drains to home owners. The amendment calls for all offending devices to be removed within 90 days.

The matter will, in all probability, be brought up again at the next board meeting, Aug. 24.

## Rains Hinder Work On Mains, Lathrup Without Water

LATHRUP — Approximately 50 homes in Lathrup were without water for more than 7 hours Friday when heavy rains hindered workmen connecting 200 feet of water main in the southwest section of the city.

Scheduled to take only 2 hours, the installation was delayed when excavations filled with water and lead connections could not be poured.

The finished job will give better water service to residents on Coral Gables and Meadowbrook and provide water service for a newly developed block of homes on Middlesex.
